Responses

1. Economic Recovery and Growth

Given the current climate of federal and global fiscal restraint, what specific federal measures do you feel are needed for a sustained economic recovery and enhanced economic growth in Canada?

Tax payers monies that are given to certain political/activist groups need to be curtailed as this is not a level playing field with only certain groups receiving funding to support their causes.
