The pension tax credit of \$2,000 is available to Canadians who recieve a company pension. Many of us Canadians saved using RRSP's and now when we retire we do not receive the pension deduction until age 65. That is discrmination on Canadians who do not have a company pension Now with pension splitting Government employees, Hydro, Bell and School teachers who retire at age 55 receive 10 years of the \$2,000 tax credit plus their spouse, 10 years X \$4,000 per year = \$40,000. For those of us who receive RRIF's at age 55 we are denied this \$40,000 tax credit. This is a major disadvantage for Canadians who retire early and use their own savings and own pension.

4. Productivity
