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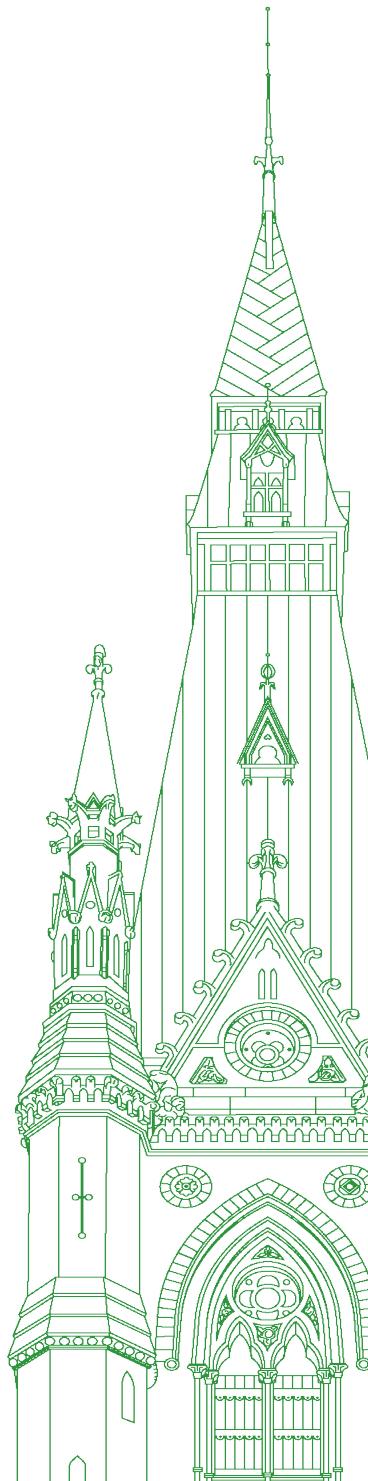

The Chair (Ms. Lena Metlege Diab (Halifax West, Lib.): I accept.

Voices: Hear, hear!

The Clerk: Congratulations.

I invite you to take the chair.

The Chair: Thank you very much, dear colleagues. It's a real pleasure to be here.
