

Report 3, Follow-up Audit on the Transportation of Dangerous Goods, of the 2020 Fall Reports of the Commissioner of the Environment and Sustainable Development (43rd Parliament, 2nd Session)

Recommendation 3: Transport Canada should provide the Committee with progress reports with regard to ensuring that containment facilities with expired certificates are not conducting the activities for which the certificates were issued.

Report:

Transport Canada produced a detailed snapshot on June 6th. At this time, 3.8% of means of containment (MOC) facilities registrations are expired, and of that number 1% are in the renewal process and the other 2.7% have an unknown status (out of the 43 expired registrations, 23 have been expired for a few days and 20 are being vetted by the Data Quality Analyst (DQAs)). All this means that 96.2% of registered MOC facilities have a known status.
