

National Overview

SUMMARY

- First Nations and Inuit communities' exposure to COVID-19 remains limited but is increasing.
 - As of April 20, 2020, a total of 53 test positive cases of COVID-19 have been reported in First Nations communities, and 14 test positive cases have been reported in Inuit communities.
 - Since April 19, 2020, 1 new test positive case of COVID-19 has reported among Inuit communities in Quebec.
- Communities are enacting public health measures to reduce potential exposure.
 - A total of 376 communities have been closed to non-essential traffic.

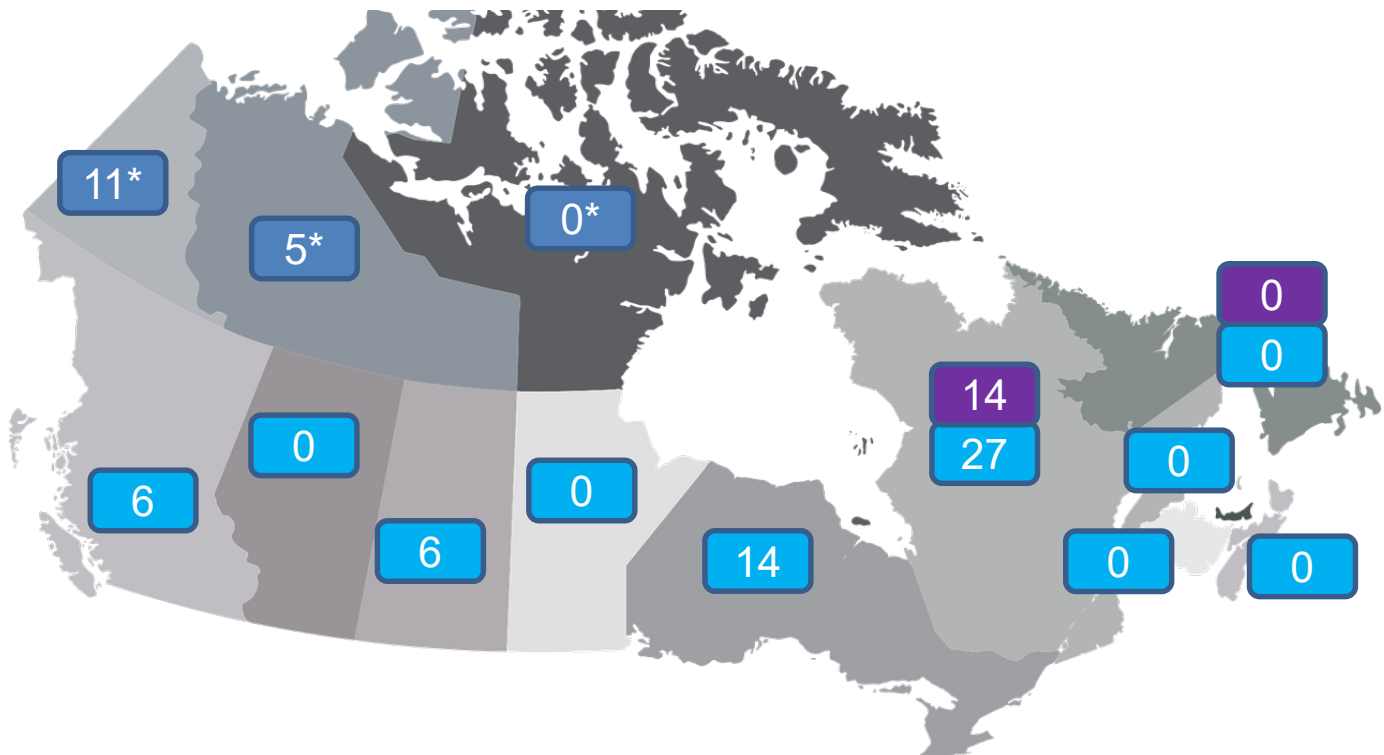
